

What is a Certified Senior Advisor (CSA)[®]?

A Certified Senior Advisor[®] is a professional who has demonstrated broad-based knowledge about aging and the important issues that affect seniors. The CSA designation is awarded by Society of Certified Senior Advisors[®] (SCSA) to individuals who meet designation requirements and pass the CSA examination.

CSA Code of Professional Responsibility

To become and remain a Certified Senior Advisor in good standing, a CSA must sign the *CSA Code of Professional Responsibility*, pledging to adhere to the following principles and standards:

- Competence
- Honesty
- Trustworthiness
- Fairness
- Professionalism
